Website alleges 11 illegals not held for I.C.E. in EC!

At a March 28th, 2017 news conference, U. S. Attorney General Jeff Sessions said that cities or counties that adopt "sanctuary" policies for illegal aliens would lose Justice Department funding, according to The Washington Times.

"According to one recent poll (Harvard-Harris), 80 percent of Americans believe that cities that make arrests - that arrest illegal immigrants for crimes - should be required to turn them over to immigration authorities," Sessions said, according to Breitbart.

In Eagle County, the Town of Avon and county of Eagle have adopted such policies.

However, the original policy that Eagle County

wanted to adopt was supposedly slightly different that the one Eagle County Sheriff James Van Beek was willing to sign. Van Beek explains his position on Page 3 of this edition.

According to Graphiq.com, Eagle County is one of a several "Sanctuary Counties" in Colorado, along with many cities and counties in California and other states that have declined federal detainer requests.

Graphiq shows 11

requests have been declined in Eagle County.

According to Graphiq.com, Adams County has declined 214 federal detainer requests. Arapahoe County has declined 139 federal detainer requests. Boulder County has declined 19 federal detainer requests. Eagle County has declined 11 federal detainer requests. Jefferson County has declined 85 federal detainer requests. Weld County has declined 54 federal detainer requests.

With reports of innocent Americans being attacked and killed by criminal immigrants who have been released from American jails, it is time to end this policy.

Other countries enforce their immigration policies. So should the United States!

Sheriff responds about I.C.E. requests to hold illegals!

By Sheriff James Van Beek

Thanks for reaching out and asking questions about where our local law enforcement stands and where the Eagle County Sheriff's Office stands in regards to I.C.E. (Immigration and Customs Enforcement) detainees and being sanctuary cities or counties.

In regards to I.C.E. detainees and the information you spoke about from an unknown or undisclosed to me website that states Eagle County Sheriff's Office has refused 11 I.C.E. Detainer requests since the beginning of the year, **I'd like to first ask what their criteria for defining a refusal are?**

Is it that I refuse to interact with I.C.E. at all, which is not true. We have and will contin-

ue to work with all our federal partners within the limits of the law?

Is it saying or implying that I refuse to hold anyone beyond their state court ordered release date or that I refuse to let them out early at the request of I.C.E. so they can take custody?

The I.C.E Detainers are only a request, they

are not a legal court order or warrant, as it does not go through any kind of judicial review causing 4th Amendment issues (The right of the people to be secure in their persons, houses, papers, and effects, against unreasonable searches and seizures, shall not be violated, and no Warrants shall issue, but upon probable cause, supported by Oath or affirmation, and particularly describing the place to be searched, and the persons or things to be seized), as a legal and valid arrest warrant would.

Sheriffs holding persons on I.C.E. detainees have been challenged and cases have been reviewed in several courts and deemed in several cases that the Sheriffs and other local law enforcement had violated a person's constitutional rights and they (local law enforcement) were civilly liable for those violations.

Every person who is booked into our detention facility is asked a series of questions. Some of those questions pertain to where a person was born, their citizenship etc. Anyone who is determined or suspected to not be a citizen of the

United States their information is provided to I.C.E. for their review.

If they (I.C.E.) determine they have an interest in a person or persons they send of notification, have the ability to interview those same people, and decide what actions they wish to take.

Once a person is of interest to I.C.E. we keep them (I.C.E.) apprised of their status within the system and they are notified ahead of time when they person of interest is scheduled for release to plan accordingly to pick that person up or not.

We DO NOT prevent them (I.C.E) from taking someone into custody, we just do not hold them (suspect) beyond a set release date, without a valid court order (arrest war-

rant)!

While there are some variations on this process with the sheriff's throughout Colorado, most do work closely with and provide similar cooperation with our Federal Partners.

As for the resolution that was passed by the County Commissioners that (*Business Briefs*) brought up in our conversations, while I had input into the resolution and the language of it, and we all agreed on certain aspects of the language used, **I didn't necessarily agree with all of the resolutions language**, other than the fact to say, 'Listen, I'm going to treat you in the exact same way that I treat anybody else, with dignity and respect in accordance with the laws of Colorado and within the rights granted to you in our

Constitutions, whether you're a visitor or a citizen.'

However I did not feel comfortable with other parts of the resolution and the language that was used and what that language implied.

So, I did not agree with the resolution as a whole and did not sign off on it.

I would stand against anyone proposing to write a resolution that would prevent my office or any other law enforcement entity from partnering and cooperating with any other local or federal entity to properly conduct law enforcement services.

In American life today, as it has been through history, we, as a society or people, don't seem able to live without getting into disputes.

Contrary to public opinion though, disputes aren't always bad. Properly handled, they can have positive effect.

Conditions change, and things just happen. Many are just handled poorly.

With that as a given, the question, as always, is, how do we resolve our disputes.

Is there an effective way to find the silver lining in a dark grey cloud?

In early days on the American frontier, there was always the duel, as

Alexander Hamilton and Aaron Burr would attest, or the proverbial gunfight /shoot-out at the OK Corral. Short of that, you can hire an attorney to file a lawsuit. Or?

Anyone can file a lawsuit!

There are always more applicants to law school than there are places, and there are way more lawyers graduating than there are jobs (and thus, practical training) available for them, so there is no shortage of lawyers who, for enough money, or even without it, will help almost anybody file a lawsuit about almost anything.

But, are there enough court rooms?

Also, however, there are not enough courtrooms, or judges, or even people willing and able to serve as

jurors, to allow more than a small fraction of lawsuits that are filed to actually go to trial.

The question then becomes, when two or more people or businesses, or organizations or families find themselves in serious disagreement, how do they resolve them?

Can they do so in such a way as to leave the parties in better shape than when they got started?

As law students, we studied Civil Procedure and Trial Tactics. The premise is that, as lawyers, we file a lawsuit and let the adversary system determine who wins and who loses.

On the other hand, 150 years ago, Abraham Lincoln said, "Discourage litigation."

A lawsuit then, is a modern day equivalent to war.

Sometimes that is necessary. But, as they teach at Harvard Law School's advanced training for attorney's, there are numerous options for resolving a dispute, from sitting down at "ye olde Starbucks," to plea bargaining with the prosecutor, to having the husband sleep on the sofa, or in extreme cases, asking the United States Supreme Court to overturn a deci-

sion from a lower court that we, whoever we may be, don't like.

How then does mediation work?

That will be the subject of upcoming articles in this series.
